

2015-2016 Non-Resident Merit Scholarships and Other Academic Scholarships for High School and Transfer Students

Montana, South Dakota, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Kansas, Nebraska, Michigan, Missouri, Wisconsin, Indiana, Illinois

Awards are based on a combination of ACT/SAT scores and high school or college GPA. In order to be considered for the non-resident merit scholarship, students should submit an application for admission, ACT/SAT scores, and high school or college transcripts. No other scholarship application is necessary. Any student receiving the non-resident merit scholarship must be enrolled full-time and will be considered for renewal after their first year of enrollment, based on their institutional GPA. Students with a 2.50-2.99 GPA will be eligible for a half scholarship, while students with 3.00-4.00 GPA will be eligible for a full scholarship.
