Articulation Agreement Mayville State University and Bismarck State College July, 2019

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to enable Bismarck State College (BSC) students who have earned their Associate of Applied Science in Nursing (AAS) degree to transfer to Mayville State University (MaSU) and enter the Registered Nursing (RN) to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program. The agreement will provide a structure through which transfer articulation can be supported.

Therefore, it would be understood and agreed that courses taken at Bismarck State College are considered equally transferrable to Mayville State University.

Transfer Requirements

(Step 1 of the admission process) Students Must:

- 1. Complete an Associate of Applied Science Nursing Degree (AAS) from BSC.
- 2. Apply for admission to MaSU
 - a. Applicants must meet university admission requirements for transfer students http://www.mayvillestate.edu/prospective-students/admissions/transfer/
 - b. Be in good academic standing (not on dismissed or suspended status) at the most recent college or university you have attended.
 - c. University requirement of minimum GPA of 2.0 at the conclusion of any semester in which the number of institutional and transfer hours attempted reaches or exceeds 64 semester hours. For nursing program admission must have minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
 - d. Complete the Mayville State University Application for Admission Online Application https://app.applyyourself.com/AYApplicantLogin/fl ApplicantConnectLogin.asp?id=may ville
 - e. Submit a non-refundable, one-time \$35 application fee. No admissions decisions will be made until the application fee is received.
 - f. Submit official transcripts of all previous academic work from each institution attended. These must be sent directly from the institutions and must show all courses attempted and grades earned. Transcripts must be signed by a school official and contain the official school seal.
- 3. Meet all deadlines set by MaSU
- 4. (Step 2 of the admission process): The following are required for nursing program admission at MaSU:
 - a. Completion of the RN-to-BSN Program application
 - i. RN-to-BSN Program online application
 - ii. Admission Deadlines: Applications are accepted year round. Priority consideration is given to fall semester applications received by Feb. 1st, and to spring semester applications received by October 1st.
 - iii. Submit a non-refundable, one-time \$25 program application fee by calling the business office at 701-788-4757, or 4758. No admission decisions will be made until the program application fee is received.
 - b. Earned nursing degree leading to RN licensure (AAS, AS, or Diploma) from a regionally accredited institution (nursing program accreditation not required)
 - i. Conditional program acceptance will be granted if applying in final semester of RN program until the final AAS/AS-RN degree has been posted.
 - c. Active unencumbered RN license or be a graduate in current semester with license pending

- i. Must be licensed by July 15th for Fall semester start/November 15th for Spring start (later date allowed only by Division Chair approval).
 - Conditional program acceptance will be granted to applicants who do not hold RN licensure but are scheduled for or awaiting results of the NCLEX-RN Exam.
- ii. Submit license information including license number and state of issuance
- iii. Should a final transcript or licensure status indicate the applicant has not met the above admission requirements, conditional acceptance will be withdrawn and the student will be required to reapply to the program in a future semester. The applicant will not be considered as admitted to the program to continue with enrollment in nursing courses without valid RN licensure. Enrollment in courses outside of the nursing major (Essential Studies courses, 300/400 level courses, and a statistics course), however, may proceed.
- d. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale
- e. Minimum grade of "C" required for all previous nursing courses
- f. Two professional letters of reference addressing nursing role performance must be submitted to the Division of Nursing's Admin. Coordinator at shannon.skovlund@mayvillestate.edu.
 - MaSU Division of Nursing Program Reference Form
- g. Identification of public health clinical site(s) available local to student residence for required clinical course, NURS 442.
 - i. Applicant must indicate potential public health agency locations on program application
 - ii. Applicant from a state other than ND or MN must be a resident of a state where Mayville State University is authorized to offer online degree programs (see <u>MaSU State Authorizations Website</u>). In addition, the applicant must obtain approval for student clinical experiences from the state board of nursing within his/her state of residence prior to being granted program admission. Documentation of state board of nursing approval using the form provided is required. MaSU out-of-state clinical approval form
- h. Following program admission, submission of the following will be required within the program's approved platform:
 - i. Proof of current American Heart Association Healthcare Provider (BLS) CPR certificate
 - ii. Proof of all current immunizations
 - iii. Signed confidentiality agreement
 - iv. Proof of health insurance/health insurance waiver
- i. Access to a computer with high-speed Internet and virus protection
 - i. Personal computer requirements will be provided upon request

Admission is competitive and is based on a point system. Points are given based on cumulative GPA, earned nursing credit GPA, reference information, previous application to the program, RN nursing graduation from a North Dakota institution, residency in North Dakota or employment as an RN in North Dakota, and existence of an articulation/affiliation agreement. The number of students admitted each semester is limited. The Division of Nursing reserves the right to deny admission. Failure to disclose previous or pending convictions or falsification of information may lead to denial of admissions or may be considered grounds for dismissal from the program.
