

Housing and Other Fall 2020 Information for Students

Five things students living in residence halls in the fall of 2020 should know:

1) Website Information: Information regarding the COVID situation and the return to face-to-face instruction and services for the Fall Semester of 2020 can be found at www.mayvillestate.edu/StudentsandParentsFall2020. Keep checking back. Information will be updated as it becomes available.

- There are a couple of posters that summarize some of our COVID expectations you play a part in. We've made some physical changes to some offices (barriers, seating arrangements, etc.), and we're moving the location of some classrooms to allow for greater space between students. Keep up-to-date at this site.

2) **Residence hall check-in day is August 22.** We have not changed the first day of class, and we've not changed the check-in date. We are asking for you to sign up for a check-in time. Do that at your housing portal: https://prdhousing.ndus.edu/masu_thdss/.

3) On approximately July 22, Director of Student Life Jeffrey Powell will be sending **housing and dining charges** to the business office. It's a lot easier to change things now rather than a week from now. If changes need to be made, notify Dr. Powell as soon as possible at Jeffrey.powell@mayvillestate.edu. (You can check the dollar values in your housing portal, under "other tasks.")

4) Many students will be getting an email from Dr. Powell encouraging them to take the first of **three training modules** – one for alcohol, one for money management, and one for sexual assault awareness and prevention. The people who don't get the email are people over 21 years or who have taken the training previously.

5) New students should have been notified of how to get into a Blackboard class (**New Comet Virtual Orientation**) to complete some tasks before coming to campus in August. One of those is your ID picture. The plan is to have your ID ready for you when you check in to your residence hall room. Follow the rules for the picture in the document above and your card will be ready.
