










ENROLLMENT










SCHOOL READINESS PROGRESS

In the 2023-2024 school year, children consistently demonstrated growth across all developmental and pre-academic domains.












PARENT INVOLVEMENT

296 family members and community members volunteered for **713.42 hours** in our classrooms!




LEARNING OUTCOMES

FAMILY OUTCOMES




