

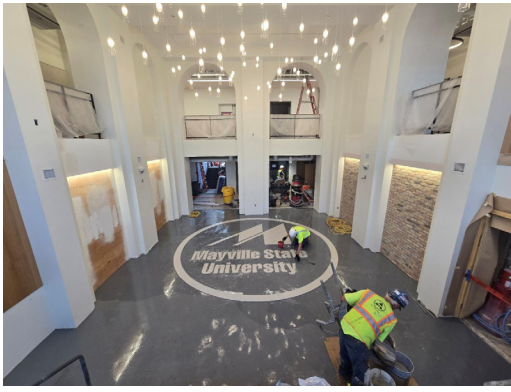

PROGRESS UPDATES

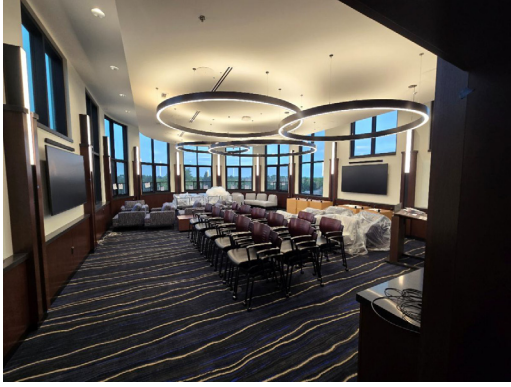
- **Basement:** Flooring is nearing completion, while theater work continues with acoustical panels and wood veneer finishes.

UPCOMING WORK

In the coming weeks, crews will focus on:

Exterior

- Hydroseeding around the site
- Exterior punch list activities will continue as the project moves toward completion.

Interior

- Installation of theater acoustical systems will continue.
- Additional wood veneer finishes will be installed in the lobby.
- Flooring installation will progress as acoustical cloud installations are completed



DID YOU KNOW?

Terrazzo flooring often doesn't look its best immediately after installation. Its final appearance comes to life once all sections have been poured, then professionally ground, buffed, and polished, revealing the smooth finish and vibrant colors that make terrazzo such a durable and attractive flooring option.



QUALITY CORNER

As acoustical clouds are being installed above the theater stage, the project team has taken extra measures to protect the materials and maintain quality. Protective plastic sheeting has been installed in front of the stage to prevent dust from settling into the acoustic panels during construction.



SAFETY TOPIC

Temporary safety measures have been installed in Stair 1 while the permanent glass handrail system is being fabricated. Because the glass panels are not yet onsite, temporary 2x4 railings have been installed from the first through fifth floors to provide the required mid-rail protection and ensure safe access for all workers using the stairwell.
