




• To get to their campus connection account, students start here:



There is a <u>very long document</u> I've provided that includes this statement: your student's housing/dining charges will appear on the campus connection account on or just before August 1.

Payment is due <u>September 9, 2020</u>. Financial Aid will pay just before that date, and you will already know ahead of time how much you or your student will need to pay.

Finally, there is a payment plan protocol on the business office website. Your student can work with our business office to set up a plan.

Authorized Users

If a family member or other outside party helps with your finances, you can set them up as an Authorized User. This will allow them to view your monthly e-Bill and make online payments and deposits on your behalf.

You can visit the bookstore in person and get all your course materials. We expect to have books available starting August 10. Physical distancing and current COVID protocol practices are followed.







Financial Aid

Federal Student Loans

- Subsidized Loan
 - 2.75% interest rate
 - 1.059% loan fees
 - Interest free until repayment begins
- Unsubsidized Loan
 - Same fees as subsidized loan
 - Interest begins accruing when the loan has been disbursed
- Parent PLUS Loan
 - 5.30% interest rate
 - 4.236% loan fees
 - Interest begins accruing when the loan has been disbursed
 - Parents responsible for repayment
 - Option to defer payment until student completes their degree


Accept/Decline Awards

- Students that have workstudy and loans offered must complete the accept/decline or reduce process in campus connection
- Know what your total costs will be for the year and accept the funding accordingly
- All students with a FAFSA will be offered a total amount of funding that will cover the tuition/fees/room/board/books/misc for a full time

Financial Aid

student based on the student's residency.

- Tuition and fees are determined by state of residency
- Room is based on a double room suite in Agassiz
- Board is the largest meal plan
- Estimated \$1000 for books
- \$3100 for misc/personal expenses



Paying the Balance due

- All charges are due per semester:
 - 2020 Fall ----- September 9, 2020
 - 2021 Spring ---- January 27, 2021
- Options to pay balance due if financial aid award does not cover costs
 - Pay out of pocket on due dates listed above
 - Set up a payment plan with the Business Office (before due dates) to pay the balance due by the end of the semester
 - Apply and be approved for the Parent Plus loan
 - If denied, the student would be eligible for an additional \$4000/yr unsubsidized loan
 - Student apply and be approved for the Private Education Loan

Private Education Loans

- An option to replace the Parent PLUS Loan
- The student is the borrower and likely will need a cosigner to be approved
- The student applies through the lender of their choice

 - Includes the lenders that the majority of our students have used in the past

Our Response to Covid-19

- The health and safety of our students, staff, and faculty is our top priority.
- All colleges/universities are responding differently. Our response is based on:
 - Coordination with local public health professionals.
 - Guidance from the North Dakota Department of Health (ND Smart Restart)
 - Center for Disease Control.
 - Cross-functional campus taskforce to identify ground-level needs for our campus community.
- The situation is evolving; so too will our plan.

Our Response to Covid-19

- Masks are strongly encouraged when social distancing (distance of 6 feet) is not an option.
 - Masks (2) will be supplied to all on-campus students, faculty, and staff.
- We have taken steps to modify our operations. Highlights include:
 - Classrooms have been measured, modified, or moved to accommodate social distancing protocols. Our smaller class sizes help with this!
 - Common areas, classrooms, residence halls and other campus spaces are routinely cleaned and disinfected; many areas are receiving additional attention from facilities staff.
 - Plexiglass barriers have been installed in service windows and other areas across campus.
 - Athletics will be routinely screening student athletes in accordance with NAIA guidelines.

Our Response to Covid-19

- We have exhausted our supply of single rooms in the Residence Halls. If a double room presents a concern for you or if you have other concerns with living on campus, please discuss your options with the Director of Student Life.
- Students will choose from the optional timeframes for move in. Most students will move in August 22, but you can see the list of timeframe options in the housing portal (https://prdhousing.ndus.edu/masu thdss/)
- Students who need to quarantine will do so in their own rooms. Rooms will be set aside for on-campus students who may need to isolate/or for the roommate(s) of students needing to isolate. We have a limited number of spaces dedicated to the process. Meals will be delivered to the rooms and Student Life will provide daily wellness checks to students in these situations.
- Planned day-to-day operational adaptations include providing disinfectant stations for student use and scheduling additional sanitation by campus custodians. We may limit the number of students in lounges, and reconfigure furniture in common areas.
