COMETS REPEAT AS NSAA CHAMPIONS DURING 2019-2020 SEASON

The Mayville State Women's Basketball team captured their second consecutive NSAA Championship last season, finishing the conference season with an 11-3 record. Over the past two seasons the Comets have compiled a record of 22-6 within NSAA play, while winning the NSAA both seasons. The Mayville State Women's Basketball Team has won three NSAA Championships since the 2014 season. The Comets also won the NSAA Tournament Championship last season, defeating Viterbo in the championship game. That was their second NSAA Tournament Championship since 2014, and the third time that they have advanced to the NSAA Tournament Championship game. The Comets graduated nine seniors from last year's team, but do return reigning NSAA Player of the year, Kylee Heurung.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL "Hoops Club"

The Mayville State Women's Basketball team is coming off "Back to Back" Conference Championships, and a trip to the 2020 NAIA National Tournament. The Comets have won three NSAA Titles the past eight years, and have been to the NAIA National Tournament three times as well. **IT IS A GREAT TIME TO BE A COMET!!!!** The Comets finished last season with a 25-6 overall record and ranked #17 in the country. The past two years the Comets have compiled an overall NSAA record of 22-6 and an overall record of 44-14. 2019-2020 Review—Coach Hutter

The 2019-20 Mayville State Women's Basketball team will go down as one of the best team's in the history of the Program. The team finished the season with an overall record of 25-6. The 25 wins, ties a school record for wins in a season with the 2013-14 team that finished their season 25-4. The Comets also finished the season with an 11-3 record in the NSAA, and captured the regular season NSAA Championship for the second consecutive season. The team finished off NSAA play, by winning the NSAA Tournament Championship. The Comets qualified for the NAIA National Tournament for the third time in the past eight years, and finished the season ranked #17 in the country in the last NAIA Top 25 Coaches Poll. "I have enjoyed coaching this group for the past couple of years", says Coach Hutter. We have seven four year seniors who have given everything they had to the program, and are leaving the program in great shape for future Comets:, adds Hutter. We also graduated a couple of two year seniors, who really helped push our team over the top after they arrived to Mayville".
