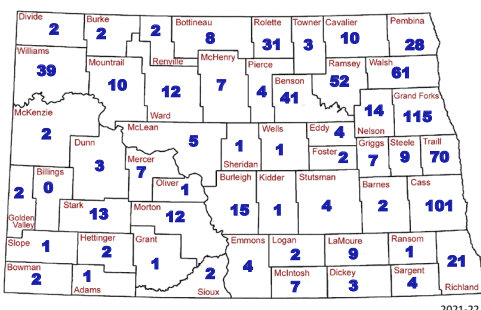

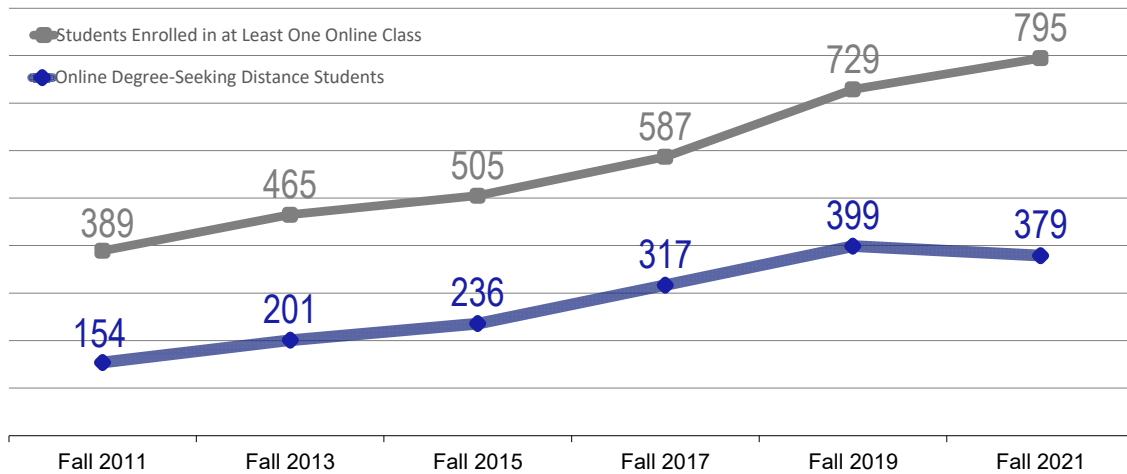

Fall Residence Hall Occupancy (% of Capacity)



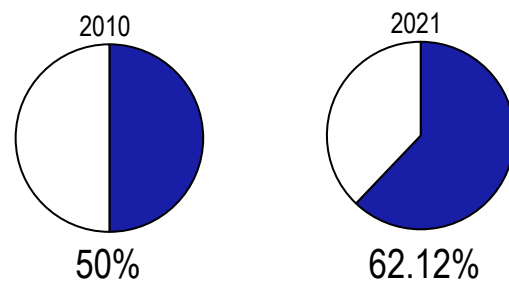

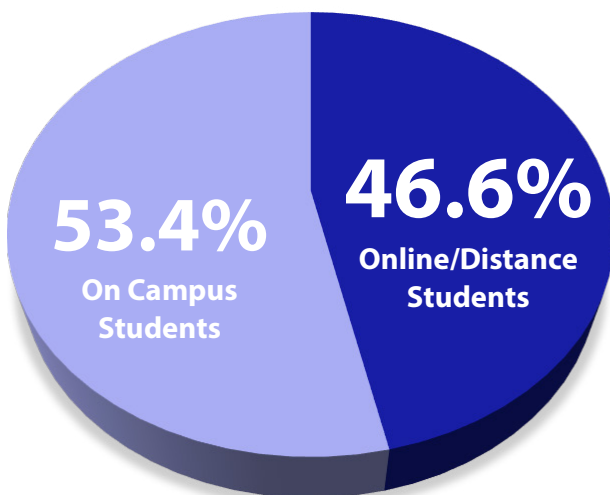

Online programs offer flexibility for students

Our online learning programs offer flexibility so that students may continue their education and earn a degree online or through a combination of online asynchronous and synchronous courses. Synchronous learning involves online classes through Zoom remote desktop connection. Coursework is completed both online and offline. Synchronous learning allows students to ask their teacher or fellow students questions while attending class sessions from their homes. Asynchronous online learning involves coursework delivered via Blackboard.

Student success is our top priority! Online students are assigned a full-time academic advisor to aid in successful completion of their degree plan.

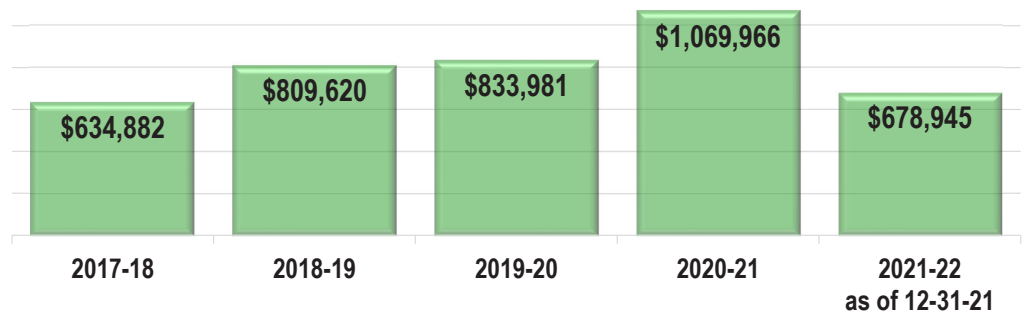

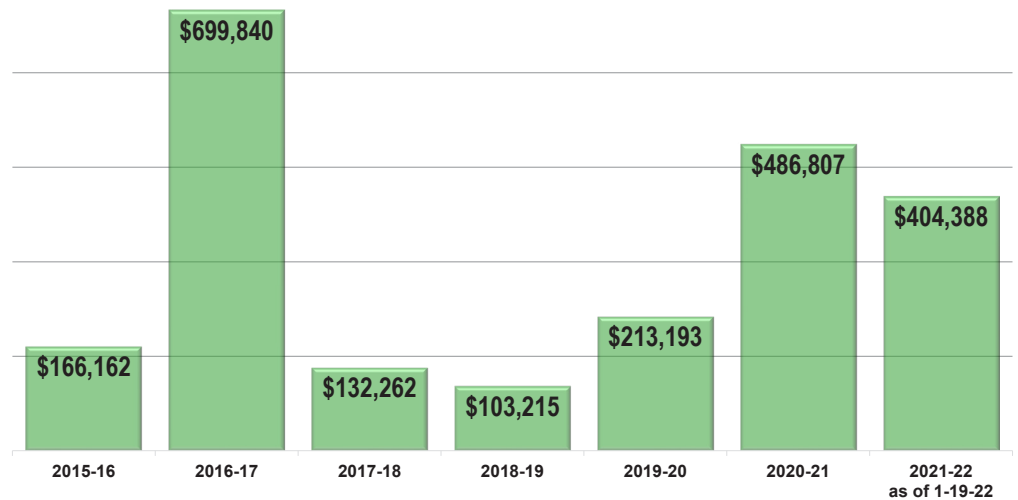
The Comet Athletic Club sponsors a number of fundraising events each year, with the proceeds of each going to support scholarships for Mayville State student athletes.



Huge Impact of Challenge Grant Funds for Students

The North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Grant opportunities afforded by the North Dakota legislature are having a huge impact on the scholarship funding available to Mayville State University students. Private gifts designated to academic scholarships are matched at a rate of 50% until Dec. 31, 2022 or until the \$700,000 grant pool has been exhausted. Scholarship gifts made at this time will make an even greater impact for students in pursuit of their educational goals and dreams

- Over \$2.5 million generated for scholarships from inception.
- Over 1/3 of our students receive scholarship funding.
- Donors appreciate opportunity to spread their gift further with matching funds.

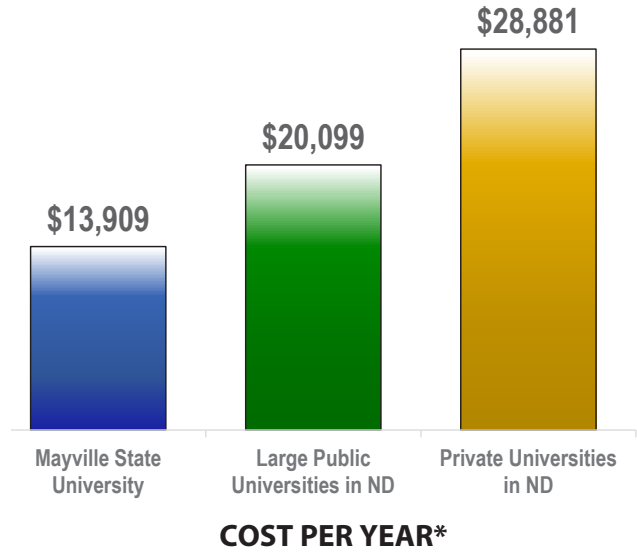

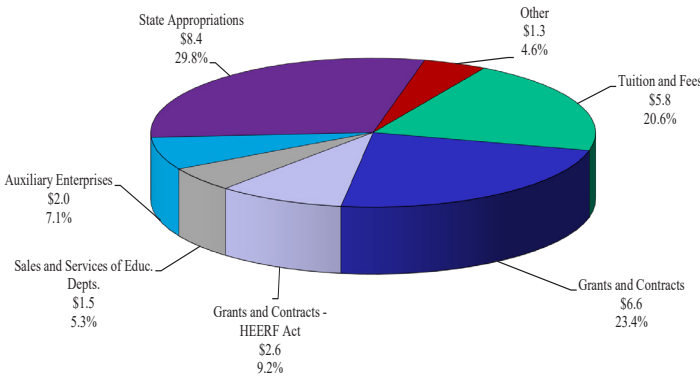

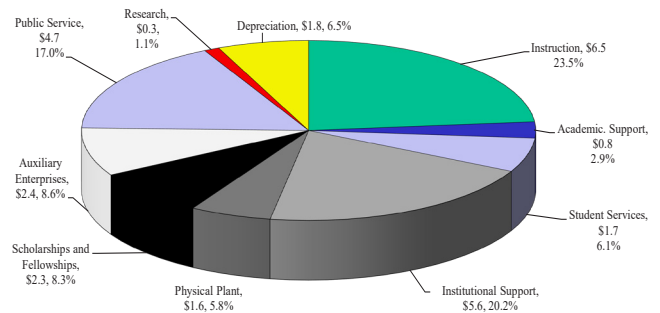


Financial Stability

\$1.6M Natural Gas Boiler Installation Capital Project

The North Dakota Legislature funded a \$1.6 million natural gas-fueled heating plant for Mayville State.

Project Details

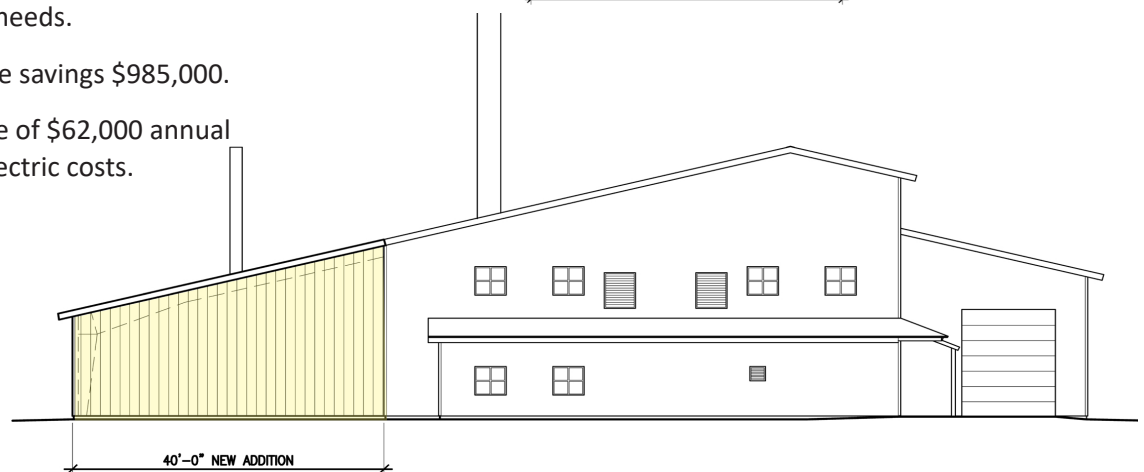
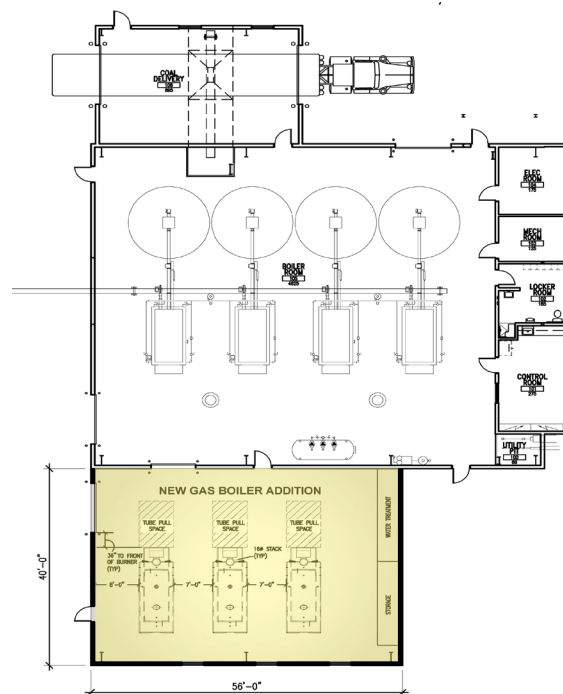
- Construct a 40' x 56' steel building addition to 2009 coal facility to house two natural gas burners, replacing old fuel oil burners, and supplementing our coal-fired heating system.
- Preliminary work is underway with the goal of having the plant operational for the 2022 heating season.
 - ◆ Project design team: Foss Architects and Martin Mechanical Design.
 - ◆ Contractor walk-through is February 8; contractor bid opening date is February 16.
 - ◆ Three buildings on campus have domestic hot water converted to natural gas.
 - ◆ MSU ordered two 350 horsepower natural gas boilers December 2021.

Natural Gas - a better alternative

- Provides backbone infrastructure for our university to grow.
- Natural gas is more environmentally friendly.
- Addresses life safety needs.
- Deferred maintenance savings \$985,000.
- Conservative estimate of \$62,000 annual savings of fuel and electric costs.

Mayville State alumni are leading the way

Prior to the launch of her business, Michelle accepted the invitation from North Dakota Governor Doug Burgum to leave a successful career in the private sector for an exciting opportunity to join, learn, lead, and be a change maker as a public servant. Upon taking office, the Governor appointed Michelle to serve the citizens of North Dakota in his cabinet as Commissioner of Labor. In 2019, Governor Burgum invited her to take on the challenge of serving as the state’s Commissioner of Commerce. Prior to this, she served as Executive Director of Job Service North Dakota, in addition to her duties as Labor Commissioner, making her the first person to lead two cabinet agencies at the same time.

Michelle received her undergraduate degree from Mayville State University, her master’s degree from the University of Mary, and her law degree from the University of North Dakota School of Law. Her father was a professor at Mayville State.

- The Division of Education earned full seven-year accreditation by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) for our initial licensure level teacher education programs.

Faculty Successes

- Dustin Olson, Professor of Business, named Mountain-Plains University Business Teacher of the Year.
- Collette Christoffers, Associate Professor of Nursing, awarded Sigma Xi Kappa at-Large Chapter Excellence in Nursing Leadership.
- Dr. Mike Kjelland, Assistant Professor of Biology, leading research on 3D Bioprinting using Porcine Collagen Matrix Scaffolding for 3D Pancreatic Cancer, Breast Cancer, and Mesenchymal Stem Cell Culture, Treatment/Differentiation, and Cryopreservation.
- Dr. Khwaja Hossain, Professor of Biology, is leading research that explores the potential of utilizing plant biomaterials in mesh like scaffold for human cancer cell growth and development that may serve as a resource for personalized medicine approaches to cancer.
- Dr. Joseph Mehus, Associate Professor of Biology & INBRE Researcher, is leading a group who study mosquito biology and ecology in the Mayville Area. This research focuses on mosquito species population dynamics and will also include determination of host species that mosquitoes feed upon in nature. This information is important when determining when mosquitoes numbers will “be bad” for humans, but also provides data critical for potential mosquito transmitted diseases to determine the spread, much like that of WNV.
- Dr. Carey Haugen, Assistant Professor of Nursing, helped secure grant funding of \$104,00 to be provided to students to support training of advanced nursing education and to decrease the financial barrier through loan cancellation.

On May 5th, the MSU Housing Department along with the Diversity & Inclusion Department hosted a 2K Color Run for students, faculty, staff, and community members.

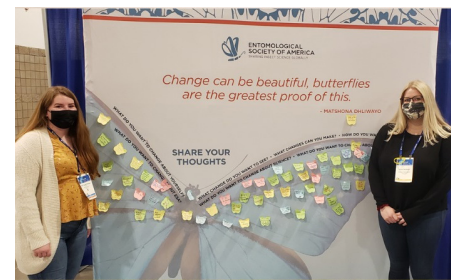
